

# £37m Victoria Hall makes progress

The Mayor of Wolverhampton as well as representatives from the city council and university made a progress check last week on the £37million Victoria Hall development.

Guests were given an exclusive look inside one of the apartments typical of the Victoria Hall scheme, which features a landmark 25-storey residential tower which is five months under construction.

Situated in Wolverhampton's Canalside Quarter, the Victoria Hall scheme will provide accommodation for students at the University of Wolverhampton and medical students at local training hospitals. A mix of three and four bedrooms, all apartments in the scheme will be fully fur-

nished and equipped with the latest internet facilities.

Mayor of Wolverhampton Coun Christine Mills said: "Victoria Hall is making great progress. I'm amazed at how quickly the scheme is coming together."

Will Evans, development director at Wolverhampton Development Company, added: "At a time when developments across the country are suffering because of the economic downturn, the progress Victoria Hall is making in Wolverhampton is a welcome sight.

"The 25-storey tower will become an impressive and iconic landmark for Wolverhampton and signal a new era for the Canalside Quarter."
